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ENROLMENT

Enrolment will take place online this year to protect both visitors and staff members alike and ensure recommended social distancing measures can be adhered to.

IF YOUR CHILD HAS ALREADY APPLIED FOR A STUDY PROGRAMME...

Your child will be receiving an email on or before the 21st August providing them with instructions on how to start their online enrolment.

IF YOUR CHILD HAS NOT YET APPLIED ...

WHAT TO EXPECT FROM ONLINE ENROLMENT...

Remote support via phone or Skype will be available from all curriculum areas, the information, advice and guidance (IAG) team and the application support team during online enrolment. All applicants will be contacted by email and instructions of how to;

Submit actual grades

We will send a link to the email address supplied on application which will direct students how to upload their actual grades on to the enrolment system.

Once actual grades have been submitted, the Curriculum team will review the results and confirm your child has the necessary grades for the level of study they have applied for. If your child has received lower or higher grades than expected, someone from curriculum will contact them to discuss their options.

Sign a Learner Agreement

Once your child has agreed their final offer with curriculum, they will be sent a learner agreement

automatically which they can sign electronically.

Submit Proof of ID

Your child will need to provide proof of ID which they can upload from a phone or computer. Proof of ID can include:

- Passport
- Bank/Debit Card
- National Insurance Card
- Provisional Driving Licence

Welcome to DCG Pack

Once your child has completed all the necessary steps, they will be sent their electronic 'Welcome to Derby College Group' pack via email.

Second year returners

Second year returners will soon be receiving an email communication sent to both their college email address and any personal email address we hold for them. The email will include a link to review and accept their 2020/21 course details. Once your child has done this, their enrolment will be complete and further instructions regarding their return to college will follow closer to the start of the academic year.

Onsite Enrolment

We appreciate that some students may not have access to the equipment necessary or may require a little more support to complete their enrolment.

All four of our sites will be offering onsite enrolment sessions to those who need it. To access an onsite enrolment, **your child must book a place on our online booking system to attend a session as spaces are limited. No one is permitted to enter a college site without first booking a place.**

If you are attending onsite enrolment, you must bring your proof of ID and GCSE results with you.

START OF TERM AND COURSE TIMETABLES

Course timetables are currently being planned with consideration for the safety of students and staff and within the Government guidelines for September delivery. The intention is that the term will start as planned on 7 September 2020 for new courses with an induction programme that is a blend of face to face and online learning for Level 2 and above students. Entry and Level 1 students will be inducted on Friday 4 September. Each course will have its own timetable, but our intention is that every programme will comprise of face to face delivery, including practical's on campus and some blended/online learning.

This is still being planned but students can expect to be completing the majority of their learning on-site with online learning forming a smaller but essential component of their programme. This will allow us to manage the number of students travelling to and being on-site each day.

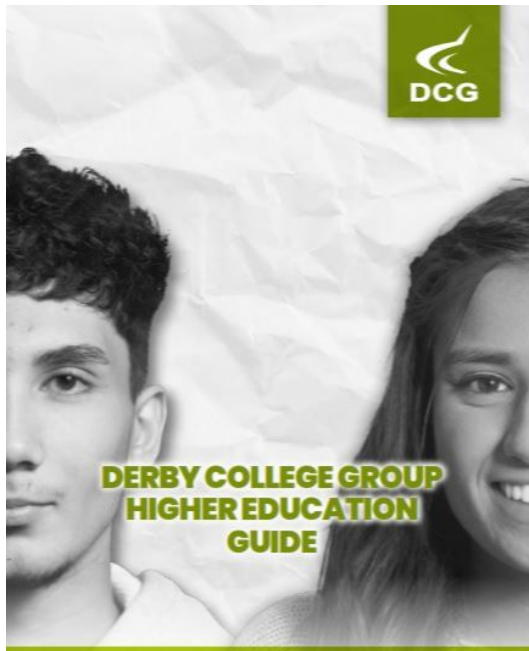
