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COVID-19 UPDATE

On 10th May 2020, the government gave further guidance regarding the reopening of educational settings for a minority of students from 1st June 2020, in addition to children of key workers and those who are vulnerable.

In response to this recent government guidance, the management within DCG are now working with key support teams (including Health and Safety/Estates and Facilities etc) in order to undertake a full risk assessment and identify detailed plans which reflect government advice to ensure we can accommodate more students safely.

We are sure you can appreciate, we need to get this right and as soon as we have our plans in place we will communicate these to you. Our priority is to keep students, staff and parents/carers safe.



Student Support Fund

As the college remains closed to the majority of students following Government guidelines, if you have previously made an application to the Student Support Fund in Term 1 or Term 2 you will not need to complete an ongoing bursary application form for Term 3 at this time, this is because we already have your details. However if any of your details have changed please get in touch with the Student Support Fund Team to enable us to update our records.

Please be advised that payment for Term 3 Travel is currently on hold as these payments are to support the student with their travel into college, if however you are still travelling into college please contact the Student Support Team to enable us to update your information, we are reviewing this situation on a regular basis and will keep students updated. During this time students who are in receipt of bursary assistance an arrangement for a payment will be made to ensure they continue to receive financial support for their meals during term time.

This situation will be reviewed regularly, so please ensure you check the Derby College website for updates.

Careers

Even though we are not currently in college, the Careers team are still available to offer advice and guidance appointments to students via telephone, Skype, Microsoft Teams or email. The team are available to support students, who are due to complete their course this summer, with their progression plans.

For level 3, year 2 students who have applied for Higher Education, for September 2020, it is important that they log on to their UCAS Track to see the date by which they must use Track to reply to their offers and to check for any information and resources from the organisations they have accepted an offer with. It is also important to complete their Student Finance application, via the Student Finance England website, before the end of May. Important updates are on the website in relation to financial support. There is still time to apply for 2020 start should a student want to, simply contact careers to support.

Those level 3 students, who are coming to the end of the first year of a two year course: who are considering applying for Higher Education, for a 2021 start, the summer term is a great time to begin the research process by using <u>www.ucas.com</u> (see the 'UCAS Hub' pages) and other websites such as Discover Uni and The Complete University Guide. Many universities and colleges have uploaded 'virtual tours/open days' onto their websites- giving students the chance to have a look around, even though we are currently in lockdown. Universities and colleges also offer webinars or live streaming events, designed to give information to potential students and their parents/carers about aspects of progression into Higher Education; as an example, this is a link to a range of upcoming live stream events run by the De Montfort University: <u>www.dmu.ac.uk/livestreams</u>

Please remind students that the Careers staff can offer help and support with a range of issues, including interviews for those who are unsure about their next step, plus information and advice for those who know what they would like to do but need help to get there or who wish to find out more about it as an option.




