Our top five tips for searching for apprenticeships:

- 1. Register with DCG apprenticeship team, the National Apprenticeship website and other quality providers, such as Rate My Placement

- 3. Keep searching regularly, as companies all recruit at different times
- 4. Research chosen industry and role by using the 'Jobs Profile' section of the <u>National Careers</u>

The pandemic has meant that children are spending more time than ever before learning and socialising online. Parents are juggling new technology alongside working and navigating the risks children face online.

Educate Against Hate

Messages of hate can take many forms. Extremist groups use them to recruit young people. It can be hard to know what to do if you're worried someone close is expressing extreme views or hatred, which could lead to them harming themselves or others. Working with other organisations, the police protect vulnerable people from being exploited by extremists through a Home Office programme called Prevent.


